
## Preparing a DVD




## **A Taking Frame Snap Shots**


Before sending the movie to iDVD some screen shots of individual frames can be taken. These pictures can be inserted in the opening screen of the DVD so that the viewer can see a summary of the movie.




3 Display the FILE menu and select SAVE FRAME.

## **B** DVD Chapters

Movies on DVD often provide chapters or scenes for you to select from. If you set chapter markers in iMovie the user of your DVD will be able to select just those chapters rather than playing the whole movie.
