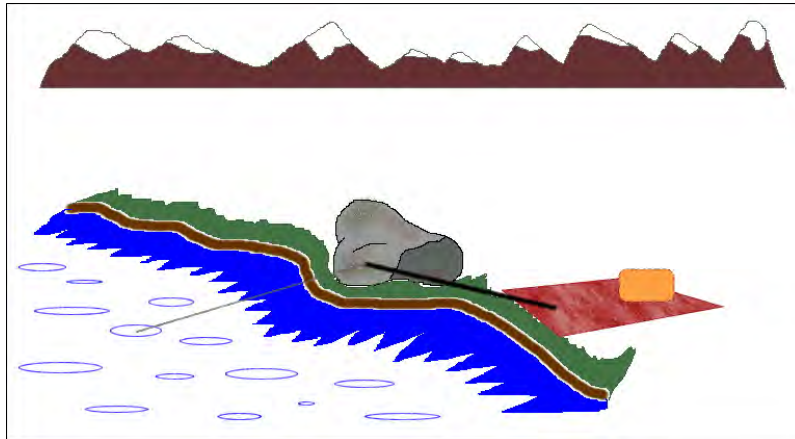


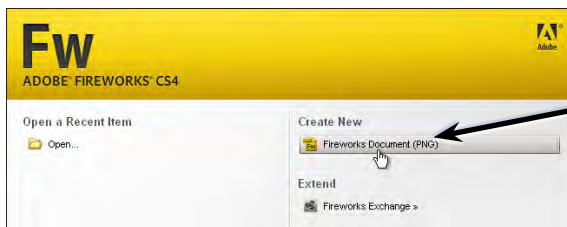
Creating a Painting

Adobe FireWorks CS4 is a graphics program that provides both bitmap and vector tools. In this exercise you will mostly use the bitmap tools to create the following scene of a fishing line in a stream next to a rock.

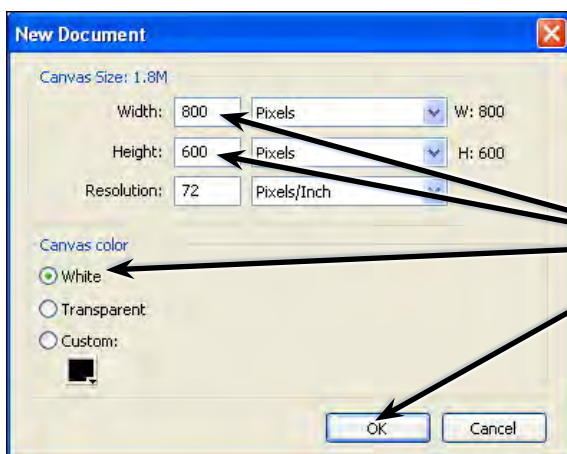


Starting the Document

- 1 Load Adobe FireWorks CS4 and the FIREWORKS START SCREEN should be displayed.

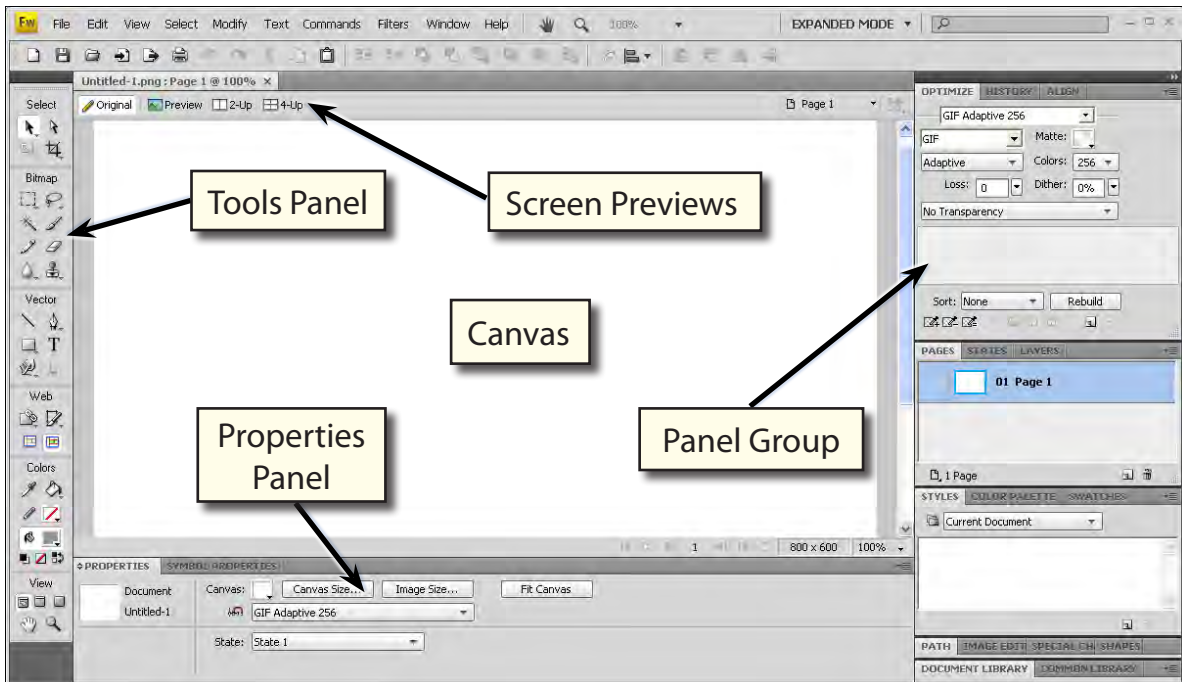


2 In the CREATE NEW section click on FIREWORKS DOCUMENT.



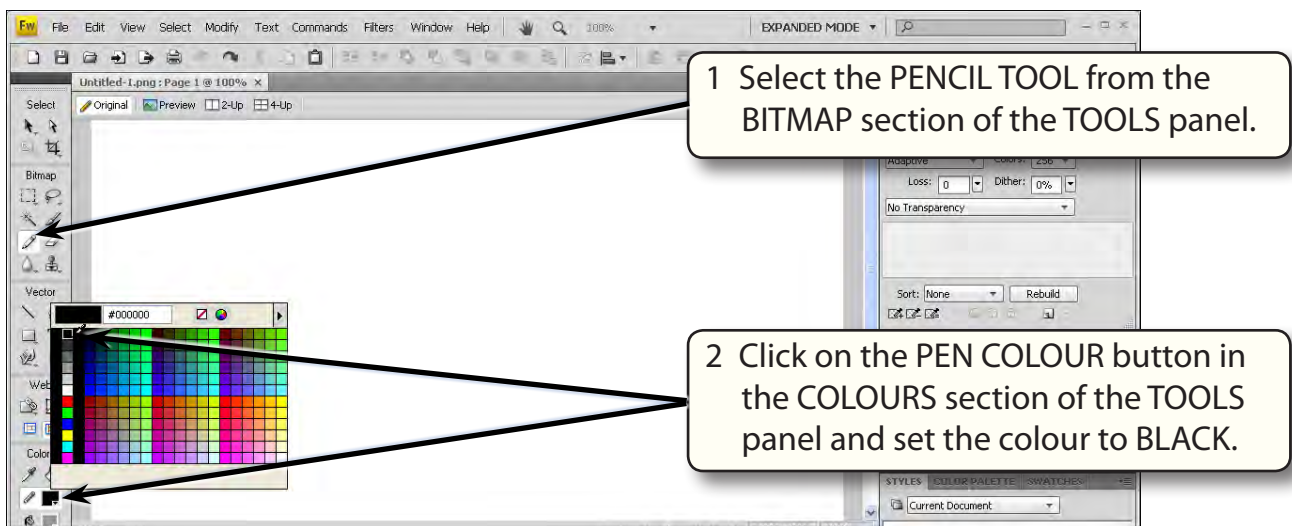
3 The document properties need to be set. Set the WIDTH to 800 pixels, the HEIGHT to 600 pixels, the CANVAS COLOUR to WHITE and select OK.

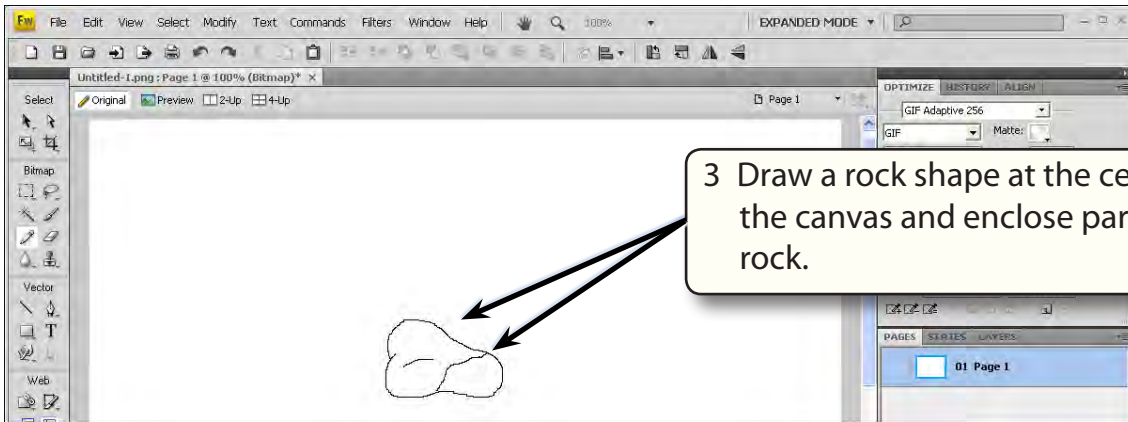
- 4 The FireWorks screen is opened. Refer to its labelled sections until you are fully familiar with them.



Drawing the Rock

The PENCIL TOOL will be used to draw the rock.

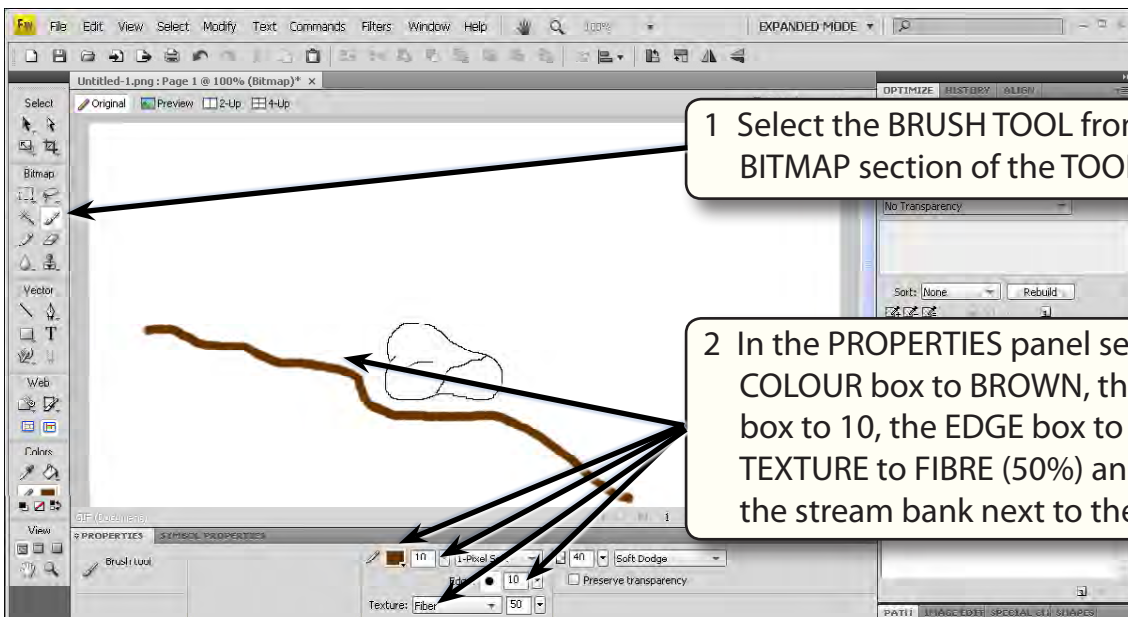




NOTE: Select **UNDO BRUSH TOOL** from the **EDIT** menu (or press **CTRL+Z** or **COMMAND+Z**) to undo steps if you make a mistake.

Drawing the Stream

The **BRUSH TOOL** will be used to draw the bank of the stream. It allows you to change the thickness and texture of the line.



3 The water in the stream will be created using the PENCIL and PAINT BUCKET TOOLS.

NOTE: If the paint fills the whole screen, press CTRL+Z or COMMAND+Z to UNDO the fill, use the PENCIL TOOL to close any gaps and try filling again.
